²Total Federal Benefits: Emergency Unemployment Compensation Benefits (EUC), 100% of Extended Unemployment Benefits (EB), and Federal Additional Compensation for claims made prior to May 23, 2010.

³OOS/Other: Washington claimants residing out-of-state or with non-recognizable street addresses in Washington.

Note: There are minimal differences in state stimulus when compared to ARRA and due mainly to aggregations and rounding methods.
