

## **Rep. Dave Hayes**

Rep. Dave Hayes has lived his life in service to his country, his family and his community. He was elected in November 2012 and is serving his first term in the Washington State House of Representatives.

When he's not in Olympia serving the 10th District, Dave is a sergeant with the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office. He became involved with the legislative process by serving as an elected board member of the Washington Council of Police and Sheriffs (WACOPS). Dave then served as president of WACOPS – which serves over 4,500 law enforcement officers statewide. His relationship with the organization proves to be an invaluable resource as someone who is familiar with what officers need to keep our communities safe.

Dave served his country in the U.S. Navy as an enlisted Aircraft Mechanic. His home port was Naval Air Station Whidbey Island, and he made two extended deployments aboard the U.S.S. Carl Vinson.

In the past, Dave has taught criminal justice courses part-time at Everett Community College and is a member of the college's Criminal Justice Steering Committee. Additionally, he has coached youth sports and served on his local water association board of directors.

Dave and his wife of 22 years, Lisa, have lived on Camano Island for the past 16 years. They are active members of Camano Lutheran Church, where Dave has served as a member of the council leadership team. In the past, he has served as a volunteer for church youth group mission trips to Mexico and New Orleans to participate in Hurricane Katrina clean-up.
