| SB 5145 | Health technology clinical committee (HTCC). Requires at least one member of the HTCC be appointed by the Washington state medical association or the Washington state osteopathic medical association. And any rotating clinical experts selected to advise the HTCC must be nonvoting members. | Dammeier | Medical technology companies. | 97-0-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 5265 | Public funds/reciprocal deposits. Authorizes public funds to be deposited in an out-of-state institution, subject to requirements including that the public funds are initially deposited in an in-state public depository and that the in-state public depository receive an equal or greater deposit of funds on the same day the public funds are transferred to the out-of-state institution for deposit. | Benton | Community Bankers of WA; Deposit placement services | 97-0-1 | 49-0 |
| SB 5458 | Health district banking. Authorizes a health district (district) to act as custodian of funds, keep records of receipts and disbursements, and draw, honor, and pay all warrants and checks with the approval of the district board. | SB 5549 | Pharmacy assistants. Requires the Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission to adopt rules to provide for the registration of pharmacy assistants at a fee determined by the Department of Health. | SB 5767 | Local gov't treasuries. Modifies provisions relating to a county treasurer's (treasurer) authority to accept electronic payments and charge transaction processing costs, including authorizing treasurers to absorb fees associated with electronic payments for taxes, and interest and penalties associated with taxes. 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| SB 6148 | Storage/personal property. Permits the owner of a self-service storage facility to tow any vehicle, boat, trailer, recreational vehicle, or camper in lieu of sale. | Warnick | WA Self Storage Association | 97-0-1 | 46-0-3 |
| SB 6162 | Invasive species council. Changes the expiration date of the Washington State Invasive Species Council and the Washington State Invasive Species Council Account from June 30, 2017, to June 30, 2022. | Honeyford | Recreation and Conservation Office Request Legislation; WA Water Resources Assoc; Stillaguamish Tribe; Nature Conservatory; Avista; PSE | 96-1-1 | 49-0 |
| SB 6170 | Retirement information disclosure. Exempts from public disclosure investment information in private funds held by a city retirement board, to the extent disclosure could result in financial loss to the retirement fund or to the provider of the information. | Roach | Cities | 97-0-1 | 47-0-2 |
| SB 6177 | Marijuana research licenses. Changes entity that reviews/approves marijuana research license from Life Sciences Discovery Fund Authority to a scientific reviewer designated by the Liquor and Cannabis Board. | SB 6196 | Energy site evaluation council. Modifies requirements pertaining to deposits and other payments submitted to the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council for the costs of application processing, site inspections, and compliance monitoring. | McCoy | Utilities and Transportation Commission | 93-4-1 | 48-1 |
| SB 6206 | Industrial hemp growing. Declares industrial hemp to be an agricultural product that may be grown, produced, processed, possessed, and exchanged in the state exclusively as part of an industrial hemp research program supervised by the Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA). | Hasegawa | Hemp Industries Association; Other cannabis stakeholders | 97-0-1 | 48-1 |

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| SB 6220 | Federal economic development funds. Requires the Department of Commerce (Department) to track federal economic development funds and annually provide funding information to the economic development committees of the Legislature. Also requires the Department to coordinate with federal and state public research facilities to leverage other economic development-related federal funding. | Brown | Association of WA Business | 97-0-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 6281 | Uniform athlete agents act. Updates the Uniform Athlete Agents Act to reflect recent changes to the model act. | Fain | Uniform Law Commission Request Legislation; UW and WSU | 94-3-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 6284 | Fire sprinkler systems. Prevents a water-sewer district from prohibiting the use of multipurpose fire sprinkler systems for single family homes or townhouses or requiring a separate water meter or backflow preventer for multipurpose fire sprinkler systems. | Takko | Washington Association of Building Officials | 97-0-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 6290 | Apple commission. Changes the procedure for nominating candidates for unexpired terms on the Washington Apple Commission. | SB 6326 | Automobile facility records. Authorizes vehicle dealers and automotive repair facilities to maintain certain required records in electronic form if the records can be accessed by computer at the dealer or repair facility's place of business during the remainder of the record retention period. | King | WA Retail Association; WA State Auto Dealers | 97-0-1 | 49-0 |

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| SB 6341 | Cannabis producer services. Authorizes marijuana producers and processors to provide branded promotional items of nominal value and certain personal services to marijuana retailers, similar to the existing authorization for liquor industry members. Also authorizes marijuana producers, processors, and retailers to link to one another's Internet websites and produce brochures related to Washington tourism, similar to the existing authorization for liquor industry members. | Rivers | Cannabis producers, processors and retailers. | 72-25-1 | 36-13 |
| SB 6342 | Private activity bond allocation. Adjusts the initial allocation of state tax-exempt private activity bond limit to give the housing category 42 percent of state limit. | Miloscia | Housing Finance Commission Request Legislation | 93-4-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 6354 | Reverse transfer agreements. Requires the state universities, the regional universities, The Evergreen State College, and the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges to develop and adopt plans to facilitate reverse transfer policies by December 31, 2017. Defines students eligible for reverse transfer policies as those who transfer from a community or technical college to a four-year institution of higher education before attaining an associate degree, but after completing 60 quarter credits or more. | Liias | Council of Presidents; State Board of Community & Technical Colleges | 97-0-1 | 49-0 |
| SB 6398 | Cultural foods. Requires the State Board of Health to consider scientific data regarding time-temperature safety standards for Asian rice-based noodles and Korean rice cakes. | SB 6401 | Secondary fish receivers. Contracts the requirement that secondary fish receivers must keep certain records regarding fish and shellfish either with the fish or shellfish or at their principal place of business, and specifies that the records may only be kept at the principal place of business if the fish or shellfish are no longer in the possession of the secondary fish receiver. | Rolfes | Department of Fish & Wildlife Request Legislation | 96-0-2 | 48-0-1 |

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| SB 6466 | Higher education disabled students. Requires the Council of Presidents to convene a work group to develop a plan for removing obstacles for students with disabilities transferring between institutions of higher education. | Habib | Higher education student associations | 97-0-1 | 48-0-1 |
| SB 6491 | Apostille services. Authorizes the Secretary of State to attest to the authenticity of the signature of a public official within Washington or a notary public, with limited exceptions. | Pedersen | Secretary of State Request Legislation | 95-2-1 | 49-0 |
| SB 6498 | Recovery sponsor privilege. Creates a testimonial privilege applicable in civil proceedings that prevents a person who acts as a sponsor in an alcohol or drug addiction recovery fellowship from testifying about communications made to him or her by a person he or she is sponsoring. | Fain | King County; Mason County Veteran Mentoring | 94-3-1 | 49-0 |

| SB 6606 | Wholesale vehicle dealers. Redefines "wholesale vehicle dealer, and requires a wholesale vehicle dealer's office facilities to be in a commercial building in the state with no more than two other licensed vehicle dealers in the same building. | King | Dealers Auto Auctions NW | 91-6-1 | 47-2 |
| SB 6633 | Marine resources advisory council. Extends the Marine Resources Advisory Council's existence from 2017 until 2022. | Ranker | None | 88-9-1 | 49-0 |
